# **School Report:**

- Enrollment/Class Sizes/Staffing
  - Currently there are 308 students enrolled at EEE.
    - Kindergarten 40 students
    - Grade 1 43 students
    - Grade 2 48 students
    - Grade 3 41 students
    - Grade 4 43 students
    - Grade 5 53 students
    - Grade 6 38 students
  - The school was recently approved for another teacher to take on a 0.5 position teaching afternoons in a grade five classroom; this allowed grade six to be split into two classes.
  - o Currently admin is advocating for more necessary EA resources.

## Technology Fee

- The current technology fee is \$32/year for full time students and \$16/year for kindergarten.
- One to one technology is provided to each student.
- EEE is up for technology to be upgraded next year as per the rotation provided by the school board.

## Terry Fox Run/Walk

- The school raised \$1675 from the Terry Fox Run completed on September 21,
   2023. The funds will be sent to the Terry Fox Foundation.
- o Great parent and community member participation in the event this year!

- Truth and Reconciliation Week/Orange Shirt Day
  - Events happening all week at EEE to signify Truth and Reconciliation Week.
  - o Orange Shirt Day will be observed on Friday, September 30, 2023.
  - A school wide bulletin board was created and an assembly and various activities will be held.
- EICS (Elk Island Catholic Schools) Grade 1-6
  - A review has been set up to measure learning loss by the provincial government; this process is somewhat similar to provincial achievement exams to obtain data across the province. The review began last year with screens in literacy and numeracy in September and October 2022 and was repeated this year in September 2023. The data obtained from the review is used to format supports for students in at risk areas in grades 1-6. Feedback from EEE teachers regarding the review was accepted and acted upon by the facilitators of the review.
- Parent/Teacher Interviews
  - November 7&8, 2023 will be the dates for parent/teacher interviews and will be made available to parents both in person and via telephone.
  - The library will be hosting the book fair during the same time period.

**Board Chair and Vice-Chair Elected -** Valleyview trustee Gerry Steinke was elected as Board Chair and Mayerthorpe trustee Diane Hagman was elected as Vice-Chair for the 2023-24 school year.

# Highlights from Board Meeting - October 17, 2023

**NGPS Vision, Mission and Values -** The Board began the meeting by recollecting our NGPS Mission: "Northern Gateway Public Schools provides a dynamic and safe learning environment that promotes connection and the authentic application of learning."

**Presentation:** from Alana Simpson speaking in opposition to the deferred Board Motion to revise transportation policy for Gr 7-9 students in the Sangudo catchment area, enrolled at Mayerthorpe Jr/Sr High School.

Presentation: from MHS Principal Beth Jager on the success and popularity of the Career Exposure Summer Boot Camps held at Hilltop Jr/Sr High School in July. There were just under 200 student registrations from numerous NGPS communities and other school divisions. The camps were open to students in Grades 9-12 and offered an array of career options via week long learning experiences. Students also earn high school credits participation in these camps. Thank you to the many Camp sponsors: RBC Foundation, Brogan Safety, Pembina Pipeline, Booster Juice, the Town of Whitecourt, the Town of Mayerthorpe, Woodlands County and Careers Next Generation.

Sangudo/Mayerthorpe Transportation - Superintendent Kevin Bird presented the Board with information relating to the impact of proposed Motion 4879-23: "That the Northern Gateway Board of Trustees approve transportation provision for students who live in the Sangudo Community School catchment area and who are presently enrolled at Mayerthorpe Jr/Sr High School, Grade 7-9 program." There are currently 17 students in Grades 7-9, representing 13 families, who are seeking transportation to Mayerthorpe from the Sangudo catchment area. The Board discussed Transportation policy, best practice across the Division, and Sangudo Community School revitalization. The motion was defeated.

Sangudo Community Engagement Ad Hoc Committee Meeting - Trustees on the Ad Hoc Committee updated the Board on their last meeting with community members, sharing that SCS enrollment has increased to 122 students. This year's school budget

and enrollment numbers has helped the school shift back into a viable status. The Committee indicated that there is no need for additional meetings at this time.

**28th Annual Employee Recognition Evening -** The Board of Trustees honoured 100 staff at this year's event, recognizing staff with long-standing service awards, the Division's Edwin Parr nominee, and retirees. We are fortunate to have so many talented and passionate professionals working for our students.

**New K-12 School in Valleyview - Update -** project planning is progressing and a Community Roundtable discussions will be held in Valleyview on November 16 to discuss ideas around the new facility.

Rural Valleyview By-Election was on October 23 - The Board welcomes newly elected Trustee Leslie Urness.

**Next meeting of the Board:** is scheduled for **November 7, 2023**, at the Division Office in Whitecourt commencing at 10:00 a.m. Members of the public are invited to attend or watch the meeting live on our YouTube channel, NGTV.
